Arena 1

Senior Style Jumping, 9a.m

Horses must be 14hh and over. Horses must not to have won more than a total of £175 BSJA (or 11 SJAI points for horses or 40 for ponies) in affiliated BSJA competitions prior to the date of the close of preliminary entries or a total of more than 10 points in BE horse trials.

Fences: 85cms, 325mpm

Junior Style Jumping

Horses must not to have won more than a total of £175 BSJA (or 6 SJAI points for horses or 20 for ponies) in affiliated BSJA competitions prior to the date of the close of preliminary entries or a total of more than 10 points in BE horse trials.

Fences: 85cms, 325mpm

Junior Novice Show Jumping

Horses must not to have won any money in BSJA or SJAI points in affiliated competitions, other than notional prize money gained in 70cm or 80cm classes held at BSJA intro shows prior to the date of the close preliminary entries and must not have won any BE points, nor to have placed 1st to 6th in any BE pre novice event.

Fences: 80cms approx.

Junior Open Show Jumping

Horses must not to have won more than £400 BSJA (or 45 SJAI points for horses or 160 for ponies) in affiliated BSJA competitions prior to the date of the close preliminary entries.

Fences: 95cms approx.

Arena 2

Senior Novice Show Jumping 10a.m

Horses must be 14hh or over. Horses must not to have won any money in BSJA or SJAI points in affiliated competitions, other than notional prize money gained in 70cm or 80cm classes held at BSJA intro shows prior to the date of the close preliminary entries and must not have won any BE points, nor to have placed 1st to 6th in any BE pre novice event.

Fences: 80cms approx.

Senior Intermediate Show Jumping

Horses must be 14hh or over. Horses must not to have won a total of more than £175 in BSJA or 19 SJA points in affiliated competitions prior to the date of the close preliminary entries

Fences: 95cms approx

Senior Open Show Jumping

Horses must be 14hh or over. Horses must not to have won a total of more than £600 in BSJA or 57 SJA points in affiliated competitions prior to the date of the close preliminary entries.

Fences: 110cms approx

Clear Round Jumping

Horse and rider combinations in the Novice and Intermediate classes that were placed in the top 10 individually at the Outdoor Championships 2008 are not eligible to compete at that same level in 2009, but must move up to the next level. Approximate starting times of classes and draw will be available from Friday 10th July at www.canddrc.org.uk

Declaration forms to be handed to the organiser 30 minutes before class is due to start, no changes to teams will be accepted once submitted and no major changes will be accepted after 7pm on Thursday 9th July 2009. No entries for team events taken on the day. Teams will jump in a drawn order, all number 1 riders going first, followed by number 2 riders and so on in both rounds. All classes will be run under British Riding Club rules. Flu certificates will be checked in accordance with BRC rules, validity failure will incur elimination but competitors will be allowed to jump HC. Teams incurring elimination after the first round will also be allowed to jump HC in the second round. Tack will be checked in accordance with BRC rules and competitors must wear correct dress at all times, when riding. The judges reserve the right to disqualify any competitor for unsportsmanlike behaviour to others and or horse/pony. Any objections must be made within 30 minutes of the incident, in writing to the Show Secretary, accompanied by a £20 deposit, which, if upheld will be refunded. The Riding Club accepts no liability for any theft, accident, damage, illness or injury, however caused to horses, riders, spectators or any other persons or property whatsoever, save for death or personally injury caused by the negligence of organisers of anyone for whom in law they are responsible. Neither the organisers of the event, nor the landowners, British Horse Society or any agent employed or representative of these bodies accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, illness, or injuries to horses, riders, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories or any other persons or property whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract, or in any other way whatsoever. Area 7 clubs will be expected to pay entry fees for the correct number of teams/individuals entered as at the preliminary stage (ie. to Stoneleigh) Please keep dogs on leads at all times.
