Area Dressage Qualifier, Wittering, July 2010

This is to fill in on the rather brief information that came in the last newsletter. The event was well organized, and with lower entries than usual, really quite a gentle day in hot sunshine. They had done a great job, but - remember the heat and dry that now seems so long ago - the ground, even to a non-pure-dressage person, was quite hard and lumpy, and all horses should be congratulated for coping remarkably well.

The novice senior team of Rebecca Jarvis & Bluebell, Alice Ward & Deanna, and Eleanor Taylor & Karen Tyrrell's Wulfstan Jazz Singer (alias Jay) were a very creditable 3rd, despite being one team member down. Well done Eleanor and Jay for an "over 70%" which gained them 2nd place in the Prelim 12 arena. Alice & Deanna were close behind with 64%. CDRC is proud of you!

The senior open team of Savanna Banchand-Davies & Ruben, Anna Cook & Oldwood Chieftain, Eleanor Taylor & Gulliver, and Polly Taylor & Secret Passion were 4th. No 70s this time, but some good 60s. Anna & Chiefy won the Novice 28 arena on 66.4% and really excelled themselves as individuals, winning the Novice 24 test with 73.8%. Very well done Anna and Chiefy!

Rather to their surprise, the team of Rebecca Jarvis & Bluebell, Alice Ward & Deanna, Eleanor Taylor & Gulliver, and Polly Taylor & Secret Passion won the Senior Riding Test - all scores well over 60%, and well done Eleanor with Gulliver for winning the RT13 arena on 73.2%, beating her mother into 2nd place. Alice & Deanna scored a massive 68% in the RT11 arena, and were 4th. Well done all. This meant that the team qualified for the Championships, but, with sincere apologies especially to Alice and Deanna, the Taylors were unable to go, which meant there was no team. We will find you better team mates next year Alice! Anna & Chiefy qualified for dressage as individuals from their wins in both Novice tests.

Festival of the Horse - Eventer trial qualifier

On Sunday 3rd Oct, C&DRC sent two junior novice teams and two junior pairs to the Area 7 Festival of the Horse Eventer Trial Qualifier held at Plum Park Farm, Towcester.

This was the first time that an Area Qualifier had been held at this location, so we were looking forward to the challenge that a new venue offered.

Unfortunately it poured with rain all day on the Saturday, and this continued with a vengeance on the Sunday, making for very wet and slippery going underfoot, and miserable conditions for both the riders and the helpers/fence judges/stewards etc.

I am proud to say that Cambridge were the only club whose members all turned up on the day and competed to the best of their abilities, riders from other clubs pulled out either beforehand, or on the day, meaning that for us at least the day was not a long one !

Our two junior novice teams consisted of Georgie Morris on Sportsfield Sea Fever, Rachel Dyke on Mirror Man II, Tabitha Love on Dottie and Jess Cooke on Pavlouska on one team, and Sam Stringer on Silver, Tara McCabe on Itinerary, Rosie Peck on Humphrey and Georgie Morris on Ripple Onyx on the other team. Both teams put up an excellent effort on a fairly testing course of show jumps, and the 27 cross country jumps.

We had one very scary moment when Sam was half way around his show jumping course and Jess was coming over the finishing line for the cross country course, when her horse decided to carry on going, and jumped clean

over the rope into the show jumping ring. Luckily both escaped unhurt, and Sam finished his round unaware of what was going on behind him! Our teams finished in first and second place meaning that Georgie, Rachel, Tabitha and Jess qualify for the Championships next June at Aston-Le-Walls. Our next event was the Junior Pairs Qualifier, by this time the show jumping ring was more like a skating rink than ever, and both Rachel and Georgie rolled one pole each, but then went on to jump a faultless clear round cross country, with no time faults.

Sam and Tara did extremely well to both jump clear show jumping, however they were a little bit slower on the cross country course, and when the final results came in it was Georgie and Rachel who took to the first place spot, with Tara and Sam very close behind them in second place.

I would like to say a big thank you to all the riders and helpers for turning up and representing their club on what really was a foul weather day, and best of luck to the Georgie, Tabitha, Rachel and Jess at the Championships next June.

Dressage to Music finals – October 2010

2010 saw three Cambridge members qualify for the Dressage to Music finals: Karen Froud and Texas Rose II in the Elementary; Tanya Bramley and Listopart in the Novice with points; and myself with Oldwood Chieftain in the Novice no points. This year the finals moved from Addington to Aintree, home of the Grand National! Karen and I were lucky enough to have the use of Arabella Chambers' lovely lorry and arrived on Friday afternoon in comfort and style having had an easy drive up to Liverpool. We chose a spot in the lorry park overlooking the race course grandstands and finishing post and unloaded our horses into the very impressive stables, those stables which had hosted past Grand National winners had their names above the door. One of the quadrille teams had a horse stabled in Red Rum's box!

At this point your chairman skipped back to the horse box, being more excited than I have ever seen her. Horses accommodated, riders refreshed, we set off for a hack round the gallops running on the inside of the race course, followed by a short visit to the Aintree International Equestrian Centre. The arena itself is very impressive, light and airy with a good surface and a reasonable warming up area, all under cover.

Karen and Rose were competing on Saturday morning. Having previously had a bit of trouble with her music we were both relieved that it played perfectly. Having finished her test we then had a photo shoot of them both at the Grand National finishing post! We had plenty of time to watch the rest of the class and the juniors in the afternoon. Saturday evening the Quadrille teams were our evening entertainment. I can honestly say I have never seen so much time, effort and man power go into the preparation of a competition. The costumes were amazing and the performances were all fantastic, if you are at Olympia I would recommend that you go and see them. Sunday morning was Chieffie's turn and as usual he pulled his best music test out of the bag. Tanya and Listopart competed on Sunday afternoon and finished a credible 9th in her class. The standard was very high and of the tests that we watched each one seemed as good as the last.

The BRC staff were all very friendly and helpful and apart from the inevitable music hiccups which the technical people managed to sort out very quickly, the whole thing ran very smoothly, on time with the results announced after the next competitor had finished. Travelling home conversation turned to next year, and to buying ponies for children that will do quadrille in our old age.

Royal Windsor Horse Show 2011

On behalf of Area 7, Huntingdon and District Riding Club will be holding a series of Round 1 and Round 2 Dressage Qualifiers for the Royal Windsor Horse Show, at Manor Farm Equestrian Centre.

The Qualifiers will be run in accordance with BRC rules, with the following extra information:

Any RC Member (except FBHS BHSI, BHSII, BHSAI, BRC Eq 4, BD Groups 1-6 and PC A Test) is eligible. You do not need to be a member of a Riding Club for Round 1, but will need to be a member for Round 2.

Round 1

The Test for Round 1 will be Prelim 4 2002

The Qualifier dates are Sunday 9th January 2011, Sunday 30th January 2011 and Sunday 20th February 2011

All Qualifiers will be held at Manor Farm Equestrian Centre, and will be direct entry to Manor Farm (www.manorfarmec.co.uk)

The top 5 horse/rider combinations for **each Club** will qualify for Round 2, if any placed in the top 5 have previously qualified, it will be passed to the next eligible rider.

Each rider may only qualify 1 horse for the next round.

Dressage Points allowed for both Seniors and Juniors is 0 - 60, with downgrading as per BRC Rule D1.1.3 if applicable.

BRC Rules for tack and dress apply.

Your Flu Vac must be up to date as per any BRC competition.

Round 2

The Test for Round 2 will be Prelim 4 2002 (the same as Round 1)

The Round 2 date is Sunday 27th March 2011, again held at Manor Farm Equestrian Centre, and will be direct entry to Manor Farm

Your Flu Vac must be up to date as per any BRC competition

The top horse/rider combination for **each Area** will qualify for Round 3
BRC Rules for tack and dress apply.

Rounds 3 & 4

Rounds 3 & 4 will be organised and held at the Royal Windsor Horse Show between Weds 11th May and Sunday 15th May 2011 (awaiting confirmation of events). The entry fees for Round 3 will be advised and collected by RWHS and there are no additional fees for Round 4. The Round 3 Test will be Prelim 13 2006 and the test for Round 4 will be Novice 39 2010.

Fit To Ride

A fun Interactive lecture

2 – 4pm Saturday 8th January 2011

Traditionally with training and schooling we focus on the horse, yet riding involves teamwork and communication between both horse and rider and in most cases it is the rider's ability that dictates the potential of the partnership, not the horse's. The aim of Fit to Ride is to provide riders of all ages and ability the physical and mental tools to ride better, safer and with greater confidence. This starts with an interactive, fun session where Jon and his team focus on the psychological and physiological effects of rider interaction with a horse using research based-fact gained from over 10 years of experience working with all disciplines.

The lecture demos are designed to introduce the rider to the physical and mental processes that occur when we sit on a horse. The aim is to leave the rider with a far greater awareness and understanding of how to use their body in a positive way to enhance performance, confidence and safety.

Each lecture uses a combination of audio-visual presentation and practical skills to provide you with the first stage of the Connect principles. These lectures are extremely enlightening and provide a valuable insight into why certain things happen on board and how we can make changes.



These are designed to be interactive and fun, with the foundations based on Jon's experience and research with top riders across the equestrian world.

“The nature of horse riding, being an unpredictable partnership with communication issues, is exactly why we like it. It’s a challenge with many highs and lows which can really test us. This is exactly why we all need to think far more about our part of the combination and prepare ourselves properly to enjoy and improve in a confident, safe way.” Jon Pitts

Following on from the lecture and subject to your feedback, I can then arrange a group ridden clinic to continue the training. This will involve a maximum of 10 horses and riders in the group, and will include each rider being videoed and then talked through the video and given specific individual exercises for you to practise and concentrate on. These group sessions can then be repeated at agreed intervals.

FAQ

"How does this differ to normal rider training?"

The basis of this training centres on the rider and not the horse, and it is founded on how the body reacts to being asked to work with another, more powerful animal where there is potential danger. Essentially, it holds the key to how we develop technique individually rather than trying to make a rider do something they can't understand or physically do, and then provides the tools to be able to do so.

"Will I need to join a gym?"

No. Unlike all other products, this applies leading research and knowledge to riding rather than trying to fit existing methods to equestrian sports which are clearly different! We have developed riding-specific exercises using very simple equipment that can be used within the home. These are combined with exercises on the horse which both allow the rider to develop correctly and the horse to flourish with a new lease of life!

Pre-Season Training Camp
Waresley Park
26 – 27th February 2011

Following feedback from last years camp and discussions from 'potential campers' at this year's AGM, the camp format has been adjusted slightly in order to try and meet everyone's requirements and abilities.

The Camp will be held over Saturday and Sunday to cut down costs but if you wish to arrive on Friday afternoon/evening with your horse/pony and stay the extra night, stabling and accommodation can be arranged but at an extra cost.

The provisional timetable is as follows:

Saturday 26th February 2010

8.30 am	Arrive. Meet & greet with Camp welcome committee
9am – 12.00 am	Morning tuition sessions
1.00 pm	Lunch
2.00 – 4.00 pm	Afternoon tuition sessions
7.00 pm	Dinner, drinkies & evening entertainment

Sunday 27th February 2010

8.00 am	Feed
9.00 am	Breakfast
10.00 – 12.00 am	Morning tuition sessions
12.00 - 1.00 pm	Lunch
1.00 – 3.00 pm	Afternoon tuition sessions
4.00 pm	Pack up and departures

Use of the facilities at Waresley is included in the cost of the camp and you may use them at your leisure between your tuition sessions (ie. gallops, hacking). It is unlikely that the XC course will be available, but who knows what the weather will bring. We won't really know until nearer the time, but bring your body protectors & XC gear just in case we get lucky.

Camp Format

This year's camp is providing a 'mix 'n' match' format; you can choose which sessions and instructor you would like to attend to suit your horse, your ability and your aims. You can choose different instructors for each session or stick with the same person through-out the camp. The choice is yours.

These sessions are subject to availability and booked purely on a 'First come, First served basis'. We have a maximum of 16 riding places for tuition. You must be 16 years of age or over to attend the camp.

The provisional cost of the camp will be £230.00 but this cannot be finalised until we know exactly how many people wish to attend and how many hours tuition we will need to pay for. Lunch for both days, dinner on site Saturday night and breakfast Sunday morning will be included in the price. However, we have asked for a deposit of £100 to reserve your place and will notify you of the balance due at the end of Jan 2011. We have allowed a provisional sum for tuition and the breakdown of costs is as follows:

1 nights stabling	£ 25.00
1 Nights B&B	£ 30.00
Tuition fees for the 2 days (4 sessions)	£100.00
Use of facilities for 2 days	£ 50.00
Food	£ 25.00
Total	£230.00

1 Additional night's accommodation & stabling on Friday evening will cost £55.00 per person
